







FINAL ROUND JUDGES


Emory Global Health Institute thanks our first and final round judges for generously volunteering their time and expertise.



Barney S. Graham, MD, PhD, is an immunologist, virologist, and clinical trials physician who is a thought leader on structure-based vaccine design, application of mRNA delivery technology, and pandemic preparedness. He is currently the Director of the David Satcher Global Health Equity Institute and Professor of Medicine and Microbiology, Biochemistry, & Immunology at Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta. Dr. Graham is a member of the National Academy of Sciences and has received numerous awards for the advancement of science and vaccinology. He obtained an undergraduate degree from Rice University, a medical degree from the University of Kansas, and completed internal medicine residency, chief residencies, ID fellowship, and PhD in Microbiology and Immunology at Vanderbilt University. He joined the NIAID Vaccine Research Center (VRC) at NIH as a founding member in 2000 and retired as Deputy Director of the VRC in 2021.

Karen Hacker, MD, MPH, is the Director of CDC's National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, where she oversees a portfolio that includes maternal mortality, school health, obesity prevention, smoking policies and other the leading chronic diseases. Dr. Hacker has a long history of public health practice and has held a variety of leadership roles in public health, hospital administration, and in academia. Dr. Hacker received her MD from Northwestern University School of Medicine and her MPH from Boston University School of Public Health and continues to see patients as a primary care physician in adolescent medicine.






Mr. Jacobs is a founding Partner in The Pendleton Consulting Group and a Senior Consultant for Coxe Curry and Associates. Mr. Jacobs served in numerous leadership positions over a 34-year career at BellSouth and AT&T. He was named Chief Operating Officer of Optus Communications, a \$3 billion local, long distance and wireless firm headquartered in Australia. He has served on many Boards, including the United Way of Metropolitan Atlanta, Georgia Partnership for Excellence in Education, the High Museum of Art, Georgia Health Sciences Foundation of the Medical College of Georgia, the Tour de Georgia Foundation, Georgia Center for Advanced Telecommunications Technologies, Atlanta Neighborhood Development Partnership, Smart Start Georgia, and the Governor's Task Force on Tourism. Mr. Jacobs also served on the founding Board of the Georgia Leadership Institute for School Improvement. In addition, U.S. CDC dedicated the "Phil S. Jacobs Distance Learning Conference Center" in recognition of his work with the U.S. Congress to improve building and facilities funding for the agency.



FINAL ROUND JUDGES



Larry Slutsker, MD, MPH, FASTMH, joined U.S. CDC in 1987 and focused heavily on malaria for more than 20 years. He served in a number of leadership positions at CDC including Director of the KEMRI/CDC Research Station in western Kenya, Chief of the Malaria Branch, Associate Director for Science within CDC's Center for Global Health, and Director within the Division of Parasitic Diseases and Malaria. He also held CDC staff positions in the HIV/ AIDS and diarrheal diseases programs. Dr. Slutsker joined PATH in May 2016 and served as the first Director for both the Malaria and Neglected Tropical Diseases Program and the Center for Malaria Control and Elimination. From 2019 - 2021, he also served PATH as a Senior Technical Advisor. Since October 2021, he has been an independent consultant to the WHO, Global Fund for AIDS, TB, and Malaria, Africa CDC, World Bank, and Emory Global Health Institute. Dr. Slutsker holds a B.S. from the University of Michigan, M.D. from Case Western Reserve University, and an MPH from the University of California, Berkeley.

Susan A. Wang, MD, MPH, is a physician and epidemiologist with more than 25 years of public health experience. She is Senior Medical Advisor in the Global Immunization Division, Global Health Center at U.S. CDC. She has broad expertise in domestic and global immunization (vaccine policy and strategy, vaccine implementation, program evaluation, costing), cervical cancer prevention and control, hepatitis B prevention, adolescent health, domestic and global surveillance to monitor antimicrobial resistance, infection control, and outbreak response. Dr. Wang worked at the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva in 2019-2021 as part of the Secretariat of the Strategic Advisory Group of Experts (SAGE) in immunization. Dr. Wang received her AB degree from Harvard College in Cambridge, and her MD and MPH from Columbia University. She is a CDC Epidemic Intelligence Service alumna and an American Academy of Pediatrics and American College of Physicians Fellow.





Barbara Marston, MD, retired from the U.S. CDC in 2022 after a distinguised career spanning more than 20 years. She has extensive experience implementing HIV care and treatment programs and has supported a wide range of efforts related to malaria and other parasitic infections. She led international aspects of CDC's emergency response to the Coronavairus pandemic and led teams during other priority emergency responses, including CDC's International Task Force for the emergency response to the 2014-16 Ebola epidemic in West Africa and public health recovery efforts in Liberia, Guinea, and Sierra Leone and CDC's public health efforts in Haiti following the 2010 earthquake. Dr. Marston holds a bachelor's in Biology and a Medical Degree from Temple University School of Medicine. She joined CDC's Epidemic Intelligence Service in the Respiratory Diseases Branch at the National Center for Infectious Disease following her residencies. Dr. Marston completed Infectious Disease Fellowship training at Emory University, and then joined the Emory Faculty, returning to CDC after several years focused on HIV clinical care.
